<p>A whole organisation approach – Making it work in work-based learning</p>	<p>As part of the 2004 WOA Pathfinder project, the Skills for Life Framework was developed to embed Skills for Life in the planning, management and delivery of learning. It likens the process of developing a whole organisation approach to a journey that starts with analysing local needs and finishes with learners ready to progress to further learning opportunities. Each stage of the journey is represented as a ‘stop’ on the line. Each stop contains links to relevant information and to material from the Pathfinder project.</p>
<p>Whole Organisation Approaches – sector report: Work-based learning</p>	<p>This report lists the critical success factors and key strategies that work-based learning providers involved in the WOA Pathfinder project (2004) identified.</p>
<p>Making the case: voluntary and community organisations</p>	<p>If you work in a voluntary sector organisation that is looking for ways to improve the communication and number skills of their staff and their clients, this booklet is for you. It is for organisations that are existing learning providers, and for those that may deliver some learning as part of other services. It is drawn from the findings of a three-year project that involved 35 pathfinder organisations across England. The project was initiated by the DfES and managed by the Quality Improvement Agency (QIA).</p>
