GET READY FOR SEPTEMBER 2019

English and mathematics Functional Skills qualifications are both respected and well-known. They help students to gain important realworld skills for the future. Starting in September 2019, the current qualifications will be replaced by reformed Functional Skills qualifications to make them even more relevant and credible for the world of work. So what's changing?

The content of the reformed qualifications is more specific and detailed than before. It will be easier to compare Functional Skills with other qualifications.

What's changing?

More emphasis on the underpinning knowledge and skills required to communicate well.

This includes a focus on spelling, punctuation and grammar without dictionaries or computer aids.

At Entry Levels there are now detailed reading and spelling expectations based on the structured teaching of phonics.

What's changing?

More emphasis on the underpinning knowledge and skills required to solve mathematical problems.

This includes using times tables and working with and without a calculator.



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HOW WILL THE REFORM WORK?
